

Narcan Vending Machines

Naloxone (brand name Narcan) is a safe, over-the-counter, non-addictive medication that rapidly reverses an opioid overdose.

Justice-involved populations are at a greater risk of overdose; people leaving jail are 12 times more likely to die from an opioid overdose within the two weeks following release, and overdose is the leading cause of death among persons returning from incarceration¹. A Narcan vending machine is a hands-off, judgment-free way to distribute naloxone with minimal burden on public agency staff.

Vending machines are available in a variety of sizes, from wall-mounted to free-standing, with prices ranging from \$3,000-\$12,500 depending on the model and technical requirements. Machines can be modified to not require payment, limit the number of items distributed, or, if using a touchscreen model, to collect data. Below are a few examples of machines the HEALing Communities Study (HCS) explored or purchased during the study for reference.
